Silver City Active Neighborhood Project Application

We are pleased you are either submitting a proposal for recognition as a Silver City Active Neighborhood or are nominating a neighborhood organization for it. The goals of the Silver City Active Neighborhood (SCAN) program are to:

1. Increase the participant's identification with the neighborhood,
2. Promote cohesiveness of the neighborhood by working together to solve problems.
3. Increase neighborhood safety,
4. Enhance the attractiveness of the neighborhood, and
5. Have fun, be creative, and get to know your neighbors.

Projects of all sizes will be considered. Every single person in the neighborhood does not have to sign up and participate in the project in order for the project to be considered. Work on the project may have been done by the residents on one side of the block, or those in 25 residences that are geographically connected. You must, however, create an organization, complete a Silver City Neighborhood Alliance Registration form and create a Mission Statement, which must accompany this Project Application.

This is the criteria that will be used to evaluate your proposal.

1. **Collaboration:** Partnering with another neighborhood group, business, city resource, church, social organization, or nonprofit. Extra points if partners are contributing money, labor, or materials.

2. **Long-Term Impact:** Such as beautifying the neighborhood, adding resources like a playground or picnic area, or safety-based landscaping.

3. **Community Building:** Number of people involved in implementing the project or participating. Bringing diverse groups of people together who do not usually associate.

4. **Creativity:** Evaluation of the creativity used to design and implement the project.

5. **Support Traditions:** Initiating a social activity which would become an annual tradition or support an imperiled pre-existing tradition

6. **Promote Safety:** Fire safety (a FireWise or Fire Adapted neighborhood area), neighborhood watch, flood issues.

7. **Bringing Together a Scattered Neighborhood:** E.g., create and hold two or more neighborhood-wide yard sales, Trunk Halloween, barbeque, or holiday decorating contests.

8. **Proposal Organization and Detail:** E.g., are the details provide sufficient to show and organized effort?

9. **A Demonstration of How your Project Most Successfully Fulfills the Mission of the Silver City Neighborhood Alliance.**
