


Mission Statement

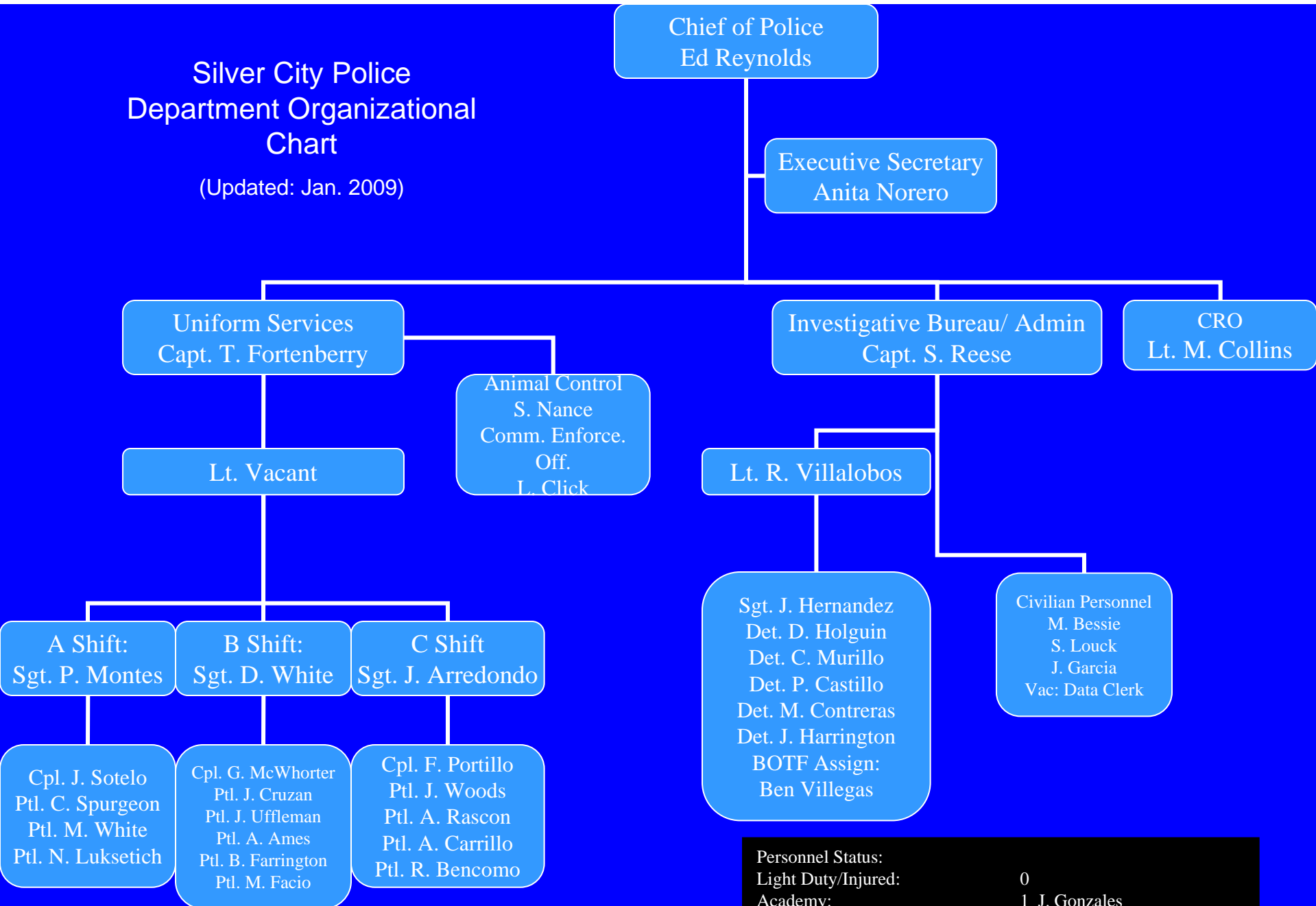


Statistical Information

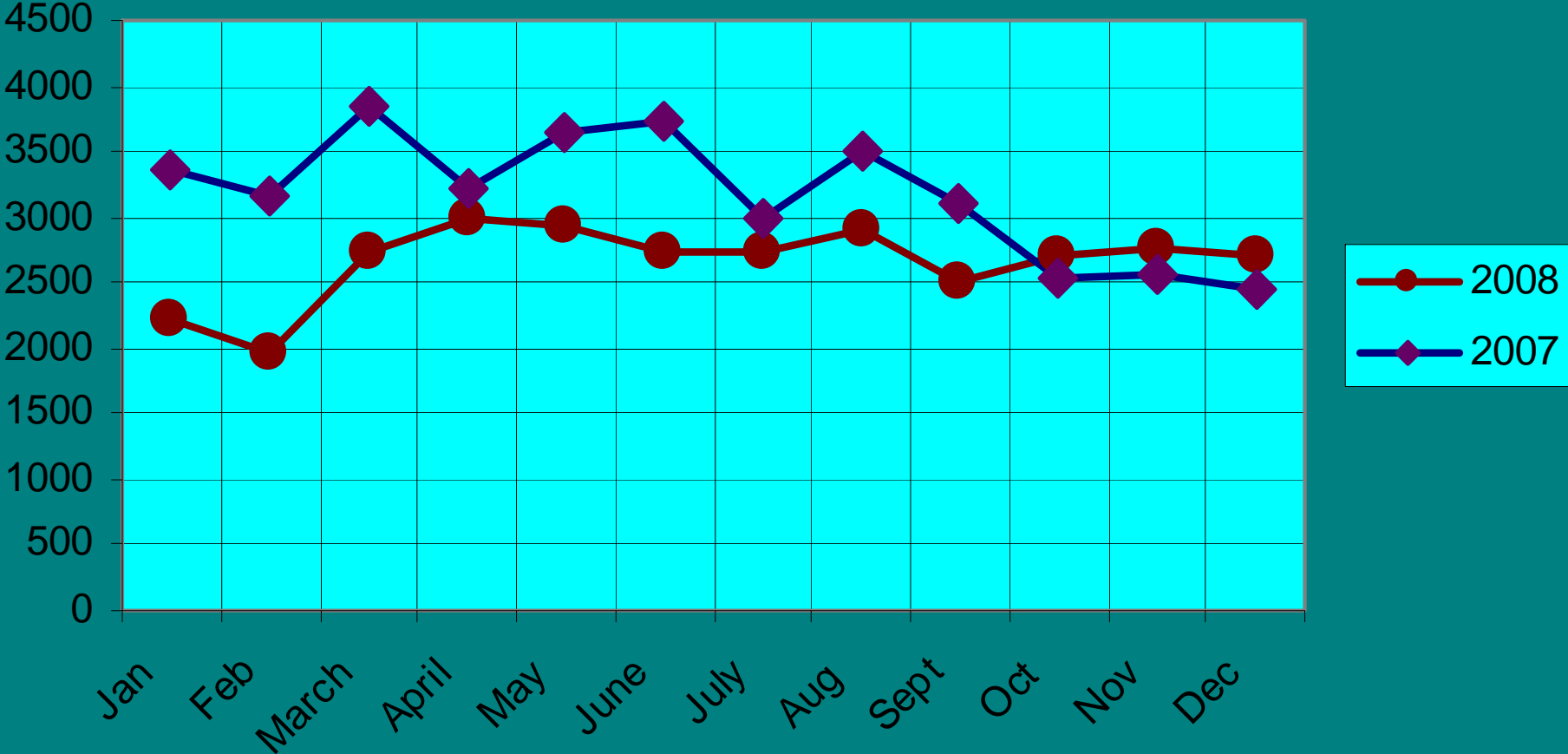

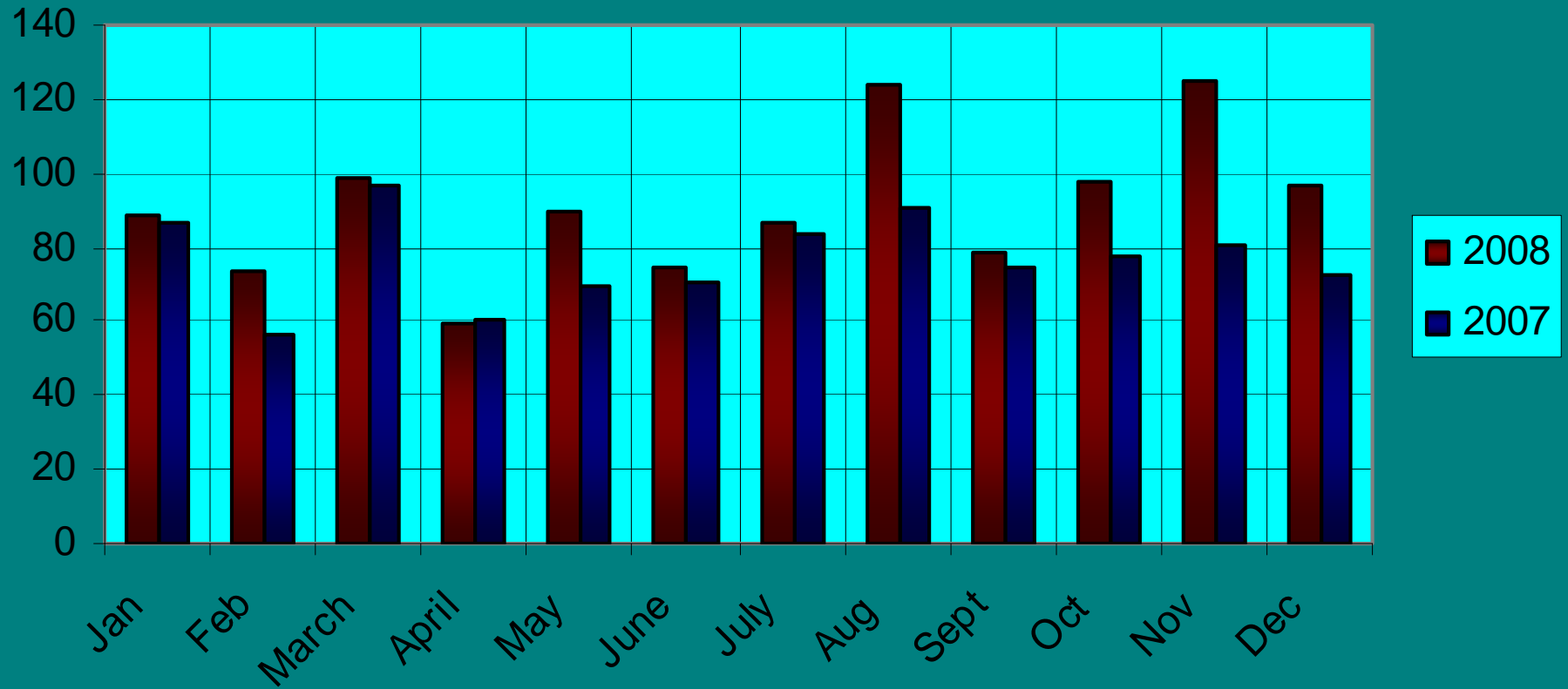

Time frame for issuance of Citations:

In a twenty-four hour period, the most citations (763) issued in a one hour period was between midnight and 1 am. This hour accounted for 9.5% of the citations issued. The second most citations (535) were issued between 12 and 1 pm. This hour accounted for 6.6 percent of all citations issued during 2008. The most active day of the week for the issuance of citations (1,504) was Friday, which accounted for 18.7 percent of the citations issued during 2008. The second most active day was Thursday, which accounted for 15.9% of the citations (1,278).

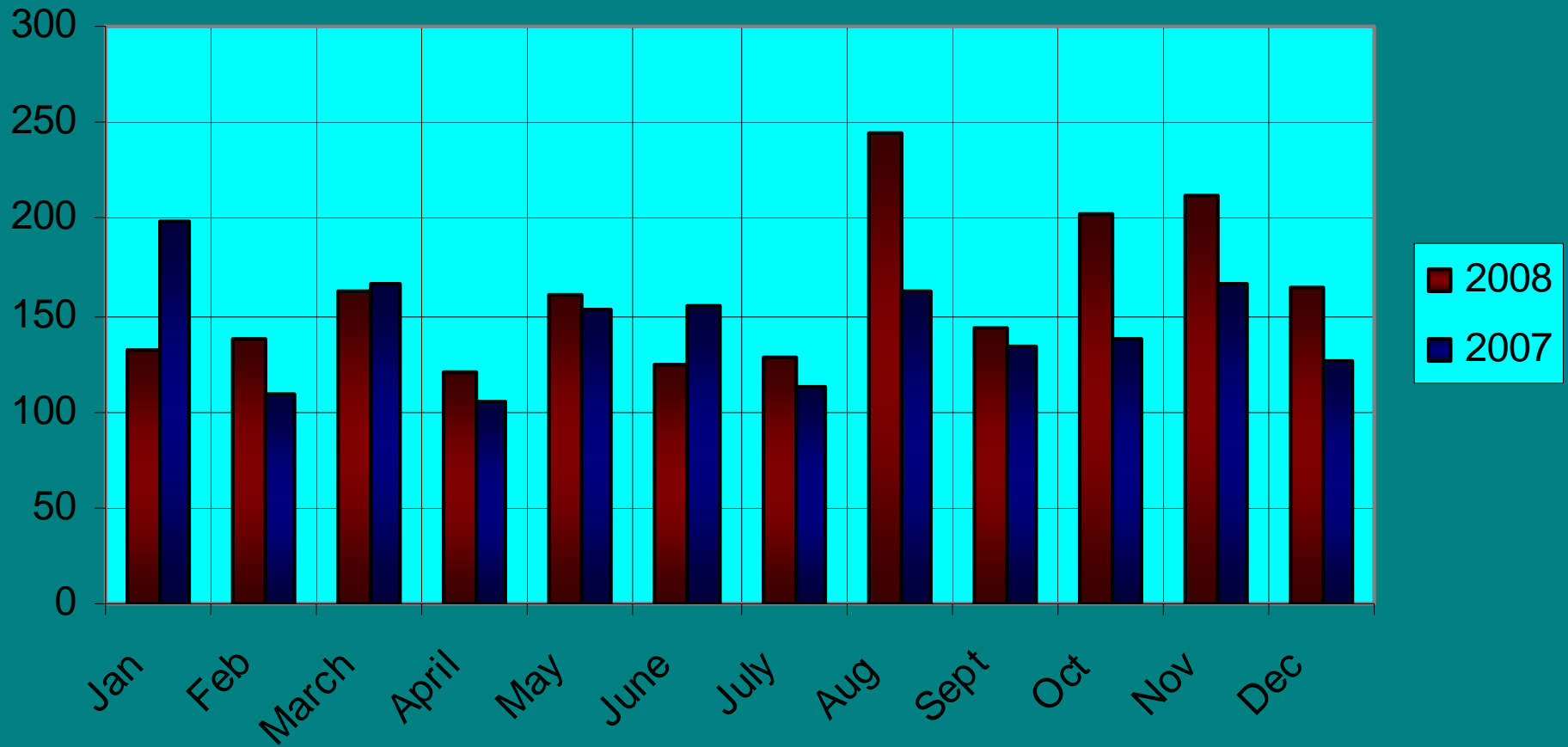

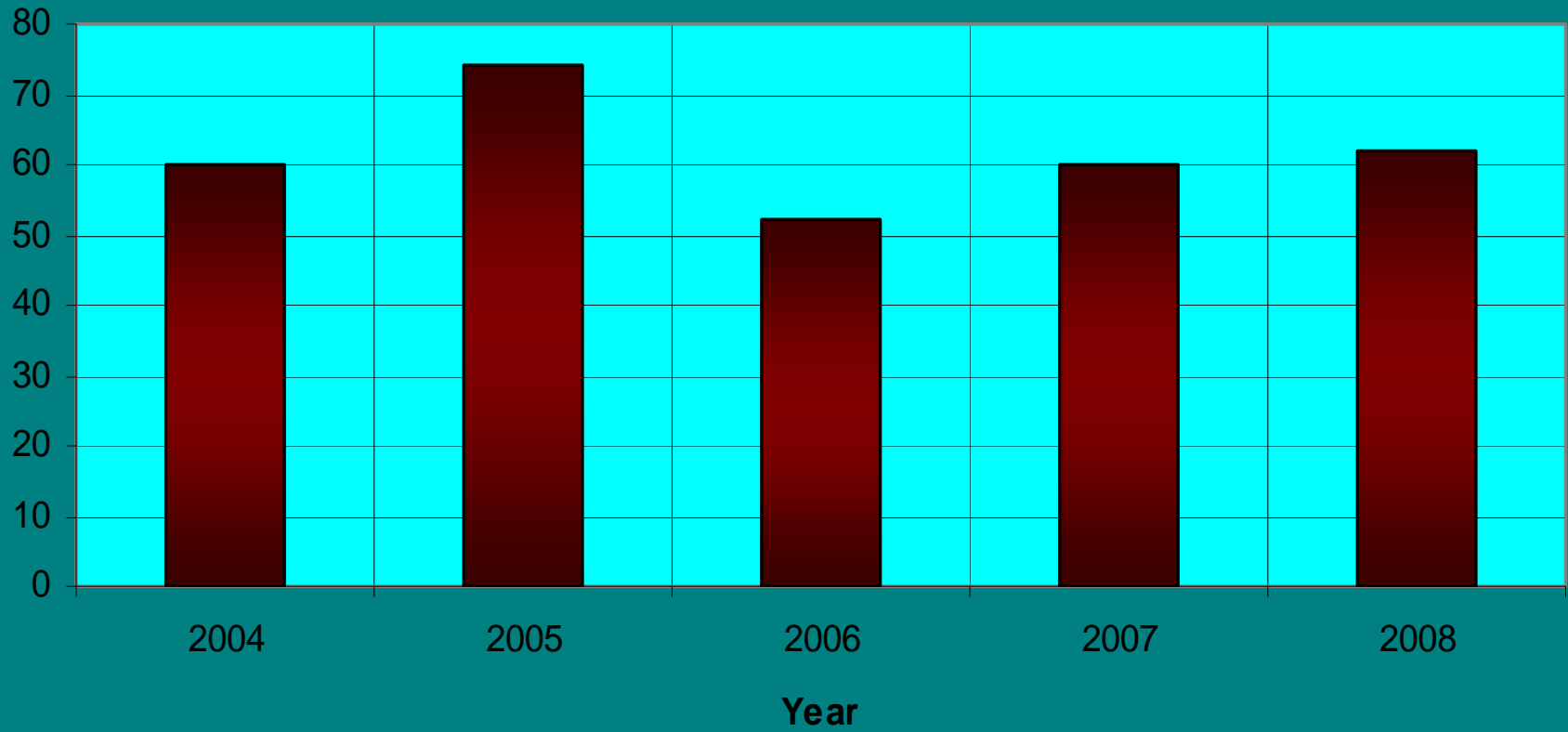


2007-2008 Number of Arrest Charges

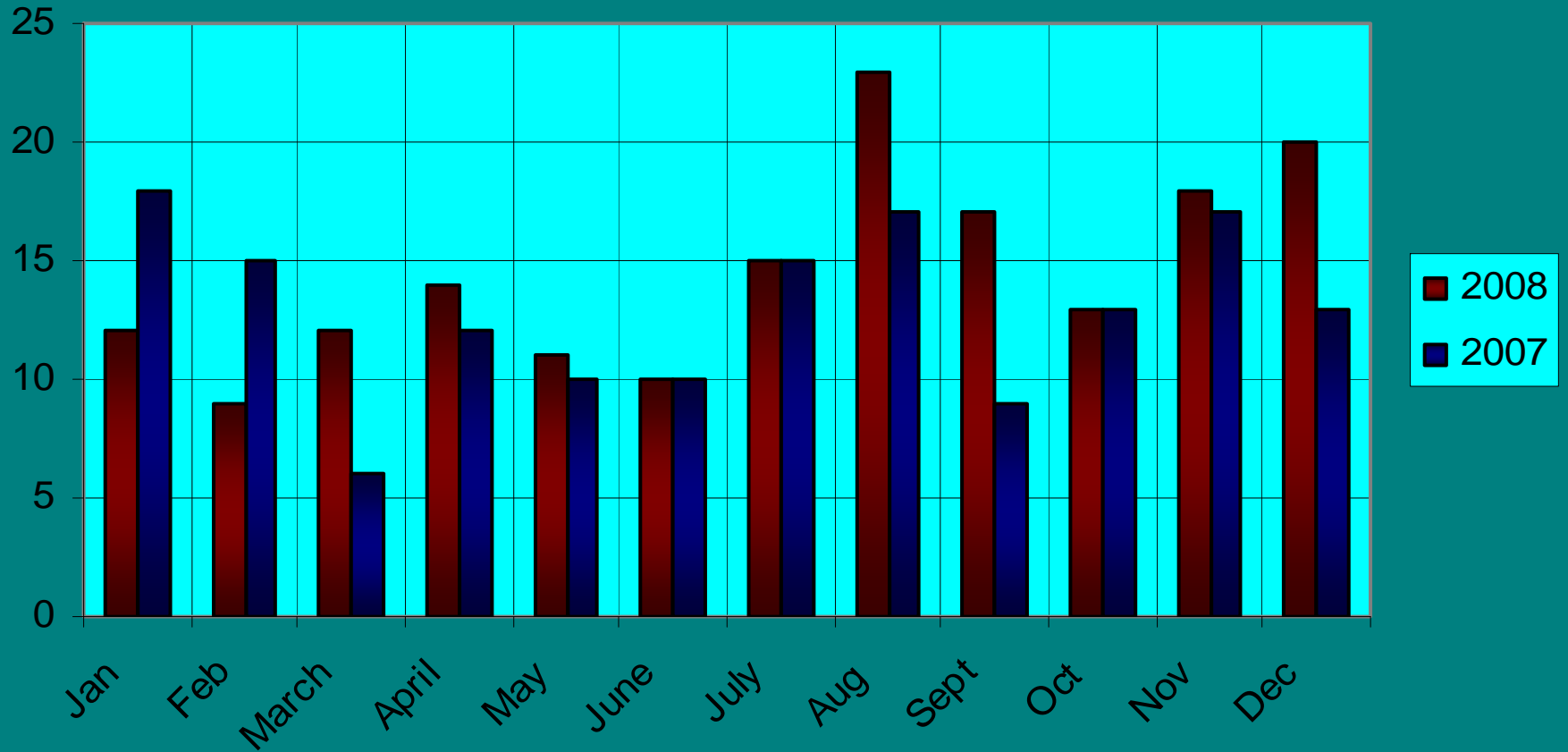

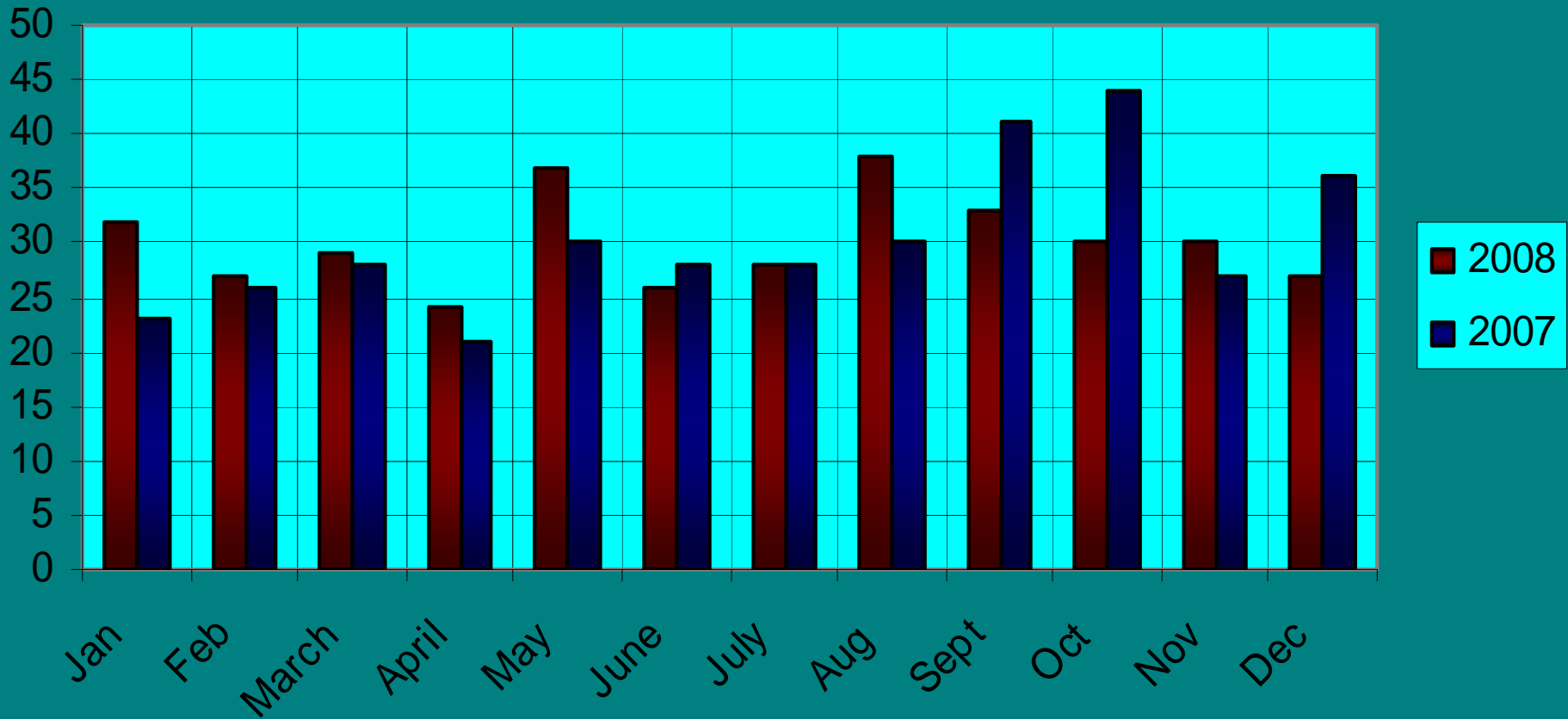

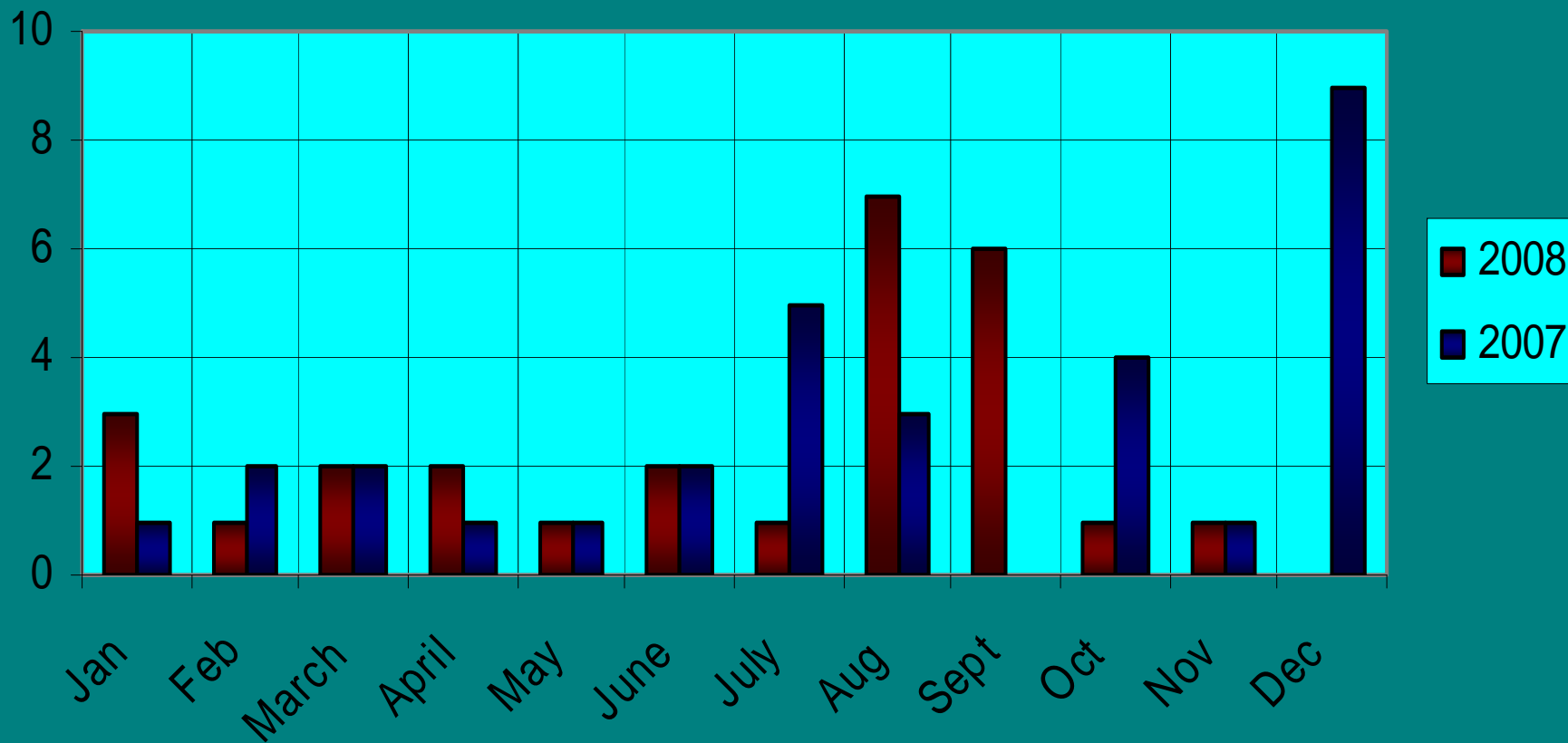

2007-2008 Stolen Motor Vehicles



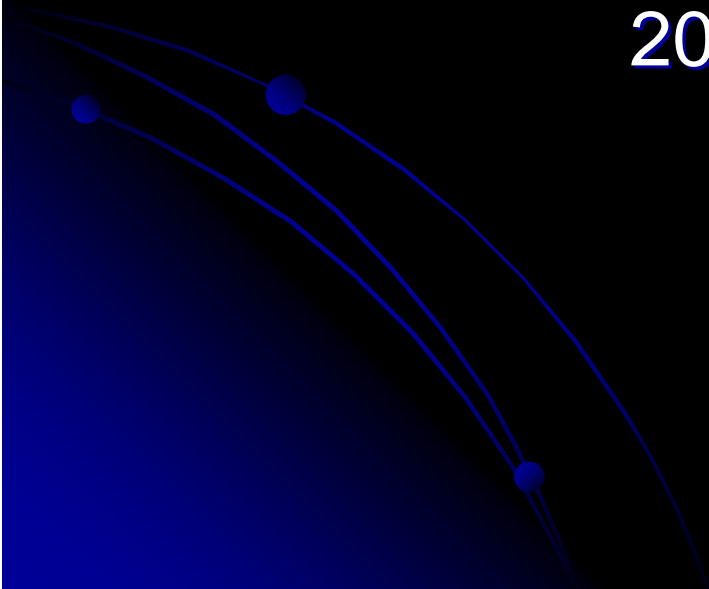

Street Gangs

- The total number of documented gang members to date is an average of 92, which is an increase of 14 over the previous years sampling. February of 2008 totals showed the number at 78. This number includes full members and associates (wannabes). The increase documented numbers are as a result of gang operations conducted by area law enforcement during 2008. This number reflects an approximate because of the changes between recruitment, imprisonment, and/or subjects no longer showing an association or membership. An example is the increase in documented membership in ESF and the Decrease in CTL. The age ranges of these individuals are from 13 to 30 years of age. Juveniles make up about 27%, 25, of documented gang members.
